## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### 1. Purpose

1.1 The Gary Ware Legacy Award for Human Rights will financially assist youth (up to and including 24 years) to bring their human rights ideas to life.

### 2. Eligibility

2.1 To be eligible, applicants must

- Be no older than 24 at the time of application;
- Be a resident or citizen of New Zealand.

### 3. Value

3.1 Up to \$4,000 will be awarded annually. This may be divided amongst a number of award winners.

### 4. Awarding

4.1 Winner/s will be announced annually at Amnesty International's Annual Hui and Skillshare held in May.

- In 2020, the Annual Hui takes place in Auckland, Saturday, May 16.
- The Award will be paid in one lump sum to the recipient/s

### 5. Application

5.1 The closing date for applications is 15 April, 2020.

5.2 Applicants must complete the official Gary Ware Legacy Award for Human Rights entry form online at [amnesty.org.nz/award](https://www.amnesty.org.nz/award)

5.3 The following information must be included in the application:

- A brief background statement on the individual or group applying;
- A summary of the idea, including what the potential human rights impact could be (no longer than 4 pages);
- An outline of how the money will be spent;
- Any relevant supporting information (photos, videos, etc);

### 6. Selection Panel

6.1 The Panel will comprise a member of the Ware family and senior staff and/or Board Members of AIANZ

6.2 The Panel may refrain from making a recommendation if it finds no application of sufficient merit

6.3 The Panel's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into following the selection meeting

## 7. Other conditions

- 7.1 Winners generally will be expected to undertake their activities within a 12-month period;
- 7.2 Winner/s will be expected to provide quarterly updates on how the initiative is progressing, including a written mid-way progress report and a final written report in time for presentation at the following year's Annual Hui. AIANZ will provide feedback or guidance as appropriate;
- 7.3 Any initiative funded by AIANZ will fit within the charitable purpose of AIANZ;
- 7.4 The Award ideally is not intended to fund travel or conference costs, but these could be considered under special circumstances.
- 7.5 If AIANZ is not satisfied at the credible efforts to deliver on the Award, we may seek repayment of part or all of monies gifted.
- 7.6 The legal protection of any confidential information and/or intellectual property detailed in an Entry is the sole responsibility of each entrant (team or individual).
- 7.7 Unless expressly noted entries will not be considered to contain confidential information and may be used by Amnesty International in promotional materials and press releases.
- 7.8 If you are the winner you are consenting to have your images and story shared publicly.
